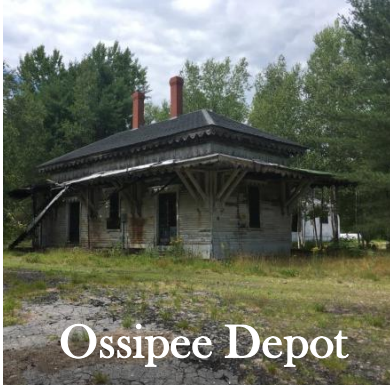


N.H. Preservation Alliance's 2019 *Seven to Save*



Ossipee Depot

Built in 1871 as one of Ossipee's four depots along the Portsmouth, Great Falls and Conway Railroad, this railroad station still boasts an intact interior and many exterior details. The motivated seller seeks a preservation buyer.



Marion Blodgett Museum
Stratford

This North Country church-turned-museum is home to the Cohos Historical Society, a group dedicated to preserving the building and sharing history from its towns on both sides of the Connecticut River. The building needs \$250,000 worth of work.

Cited as one of the finest Greek Revival churches in Belknap County, this National Register-listed building needs a new roof, sills, and structural repairs to the steeple that have plagued the building for over 100 years. The 1842 church remains an anchor for Lower Gilmanton.

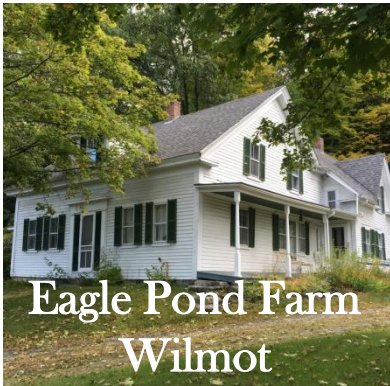


First Baptist Church

This Carpenter Gothic Cottage was built in 1850, and most recently served as town offices until 2007, when it was abandoned. A local effort wants to try a creative lease or sale that will preserve it and add vibrancy to the Chesterfield village.

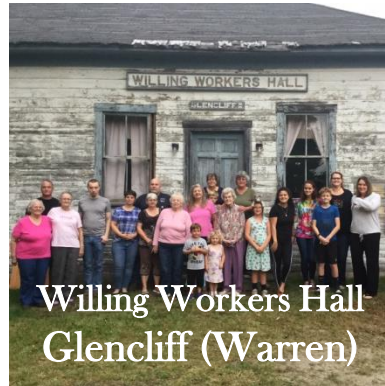


Marsh House

Home of poets Donald Hall and Jane Kenyon, Eagle Pond Farm inspired decades of writing about place, and the seasons and people who came with it. A group now wants to preserve the place, but keep it alive with creative minds.



Willing Workers Hall
Glenclyff (Warren)

This small building houses an organization committed to doing good deeds in the community and fundraising for those in need. Built in 1915, the hall now needs willing workers (and donors!) to roof it, paint it, and fix its windows, among other items.

Perhaps no business matters more to a small town than a general store. When these staples close – as many have in New Hampshire in the past decade – some can re-open, but others need a localized and creative boost to remain the heart of the community.
