New Hampshire Preservation 2022 Aliance Annual Report

n many fronts, the Preservation Alliance expanded preservation activity during the past year. More investment in old places, downtowns and village centers; greater understanding of preservation strategies and benefits; and more people in the preservation movement. We helped you and others as we emerged from the pandemic, with long-time and new services, as people reevaluated what was important to them, adapted their homes for new uses, or struggled to help Main Street community landmarks survive and thrive during the pandemic.

Understanding trends and meeting the needs of existing and new audiences were key to our success. We attracted new sources of funding, built staff and capacity, and made sound financial decisions based on new policies and procedures to close the year in a positive position.

Our board and staff embraced a new three-year strategic plan. We want to build on our strengths and help address climate issues, the housing crunch and the critical shortages in the preservation trades, while enhancing core services.

xamples of our impact, organized by strategic objective:

Increasing preservation investment

- Seven to Save, now in its seventeenth year, has listed over 100 endangered properties or resources and continues to post a 50% success rate, rescuing more than 50 major historic properties.
- Nearly all the historic preservation grant recipients in 2022's N.H. Land and Community Heritage Investment Program funding cycle were helped by our building assessment grant program. To date, the program has helped more than 90 community landmarks in nearly 80 towns and cities.
- Interest in barn preservation remained high. Several property owners received assessment grants funding an expert consultation with a barn contractor.

Increasing understanding of preservation strategies and benefits

- Votes at town meetings across the state showed new or renewed support for investing in community landmarks and historic assets and embracing preservation planning tools. We bat nearly .1000!
- Nearly half of our communities have adopted the popular barn tax incentive, RSA 79-D, providing tax relief to owners of over 600 historic farm structures.
- Stratham adopted a zoning overlay for its Portsmouth Avenue/Route 33 corridor; it's considered the first Neighborhood Heritage Area in the state.
- Swanzey and Boscawen adopted the Community Revitalization Tax Relief Incentive, RSA 79-E, to encourage new investment in historic rehabilitation projects.
- The Alliance continues to work with private owners to place preservation easements on historic structures to safeguard the property when they no longer own it.
- Increasing base of preservation members and supporters
- Many attendees at our 20 wellreceived virtual educational programs this year were new to us, and many became donors. Our Expo on the Road series was

- Our new weekly e-blast is boasting higher-thanindustry open and click rates, and early reviews of our new mobile-friendly website are positive.
- Our networks of qualified tradespeople throughout the state are growing. More preservation-related businesses have signed on to be listed in our online Preservation Directory.
- We hit our fundraising targets and have replaced startup funds from donors with diverse contributed and earned revenues (a 26% increase in core operating revenues).
